Only one student nomination will be selected to represent our esteemed university as an oral presenter. - Students' Actions in the field of environment.
- Students' Actions in the field of food.
- Students' Actions in the field of education.
- Students' Actions in the field of community development.

The students are requested to contact their respective Deans of the Colleges immediately to send their interest by submitting their application enclosed format, abstract and other related documents immediately.

Deans will further recommend two students from each college latest by **January 12, 2025** for sending nominations to University of Agriculture, Tokyo. No application will be entertained after last date.


All required application documents should be submitted no later than Friday, February 27, 2026.

*Pushing Boundaries: Inclusive Activities for Community Welfare*

Date: June 30 – July 3, 2026

## Statement

As we celebrate the 25th anniversary of the International Students Summit on Food, Agriculture and Environment (ISS), it is important to reflect on the pressing global challenges that define our time. The world today faces unprecedented challenges in the domains of food security, sustainable agriculture, and environmental conservation. Climate change, resource depletion, loss of biodiversity, and unequal access to nutritious food threaten not only ecological balance but also the well-being of communities across the globe. These complex issues demand innovative, inclusive, and community-centered approaches that go beyond traditional boundaries. In this context, students have a unique role to play as catalysts of change. As emerging leaders, they can harness their knowledge, creativity, and collaborative spirit to design solutions that address local and global challenges simultaneously. By engaging in inclusive activities, whether as individuals championing sustainable practices in their daily lives, or through collective action in collaboration with companies, institutions, and communities, students can transform ideas into impactful initiatives. For instance, they can lead campaigns on responsible consumption, initiate community-based agricultural projects, or partner with organizations to implement technologies that improve food production while conserving natural resources. Such actions not only strengthen community welfare but also inspire broader participation and long-term change.

Tokyo University of Agriculture (Tokyo NODAI) is organizing the “25th International Students Summit (ISS)” to provide students from our global partner universities with an opportunity to gather, exchange views and ideas on global food, agricultural, and environmental issues, and discuss their roles in promoting sustainable development.

The 25th ISS will be held from June 30–July 3, 2026, under the theme “*Pushing Boundaries: Inclusive Activities for Community Welfare*”, which was adopted at the 24th ISS hosted by IPB University in Bogor, Indonesia. Participating students are expected to attend in person and present activities undertaken at their home universities that have made, or are making, a positive impact on their communities. These student-led actions may take the form of new ideas or ongoing initiatives. Presentations should clearly explain the rationale, methods, implications (economic, social, and cultural), and constraints of the activities to highlight students’ contributions to solving global challenges and advancing sustainability. Each selected partner university will be allocated **one slot** for an oral presentation in one of the following fields:

- Students’ Actions in the field of agriculture
- Students’ Actions in the field of environment
- Students’ Actions in the field of food
- Students’ Actions in the field of education
- Students’ Actions in the field of community development

-Submitted ISS manuscripts will be reviewed by the ISS Committee during the screening process, following the provided criteria, and evaluated to ensure that the presentation is aligned with the ISS main theme.

-Each partner university is required to appoint faculty advisor(s) to support the presenter(s). Advisors are welcome to attend the ISS in person if self-sponsored or otherwise supported.
